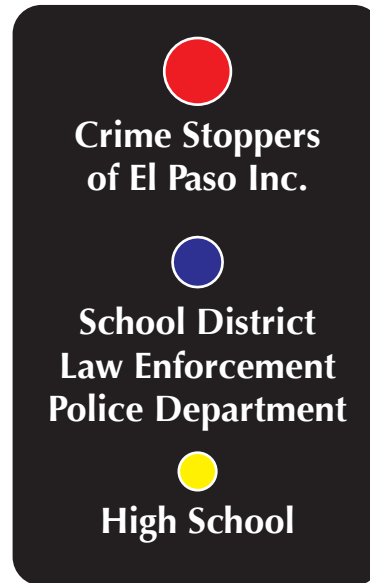
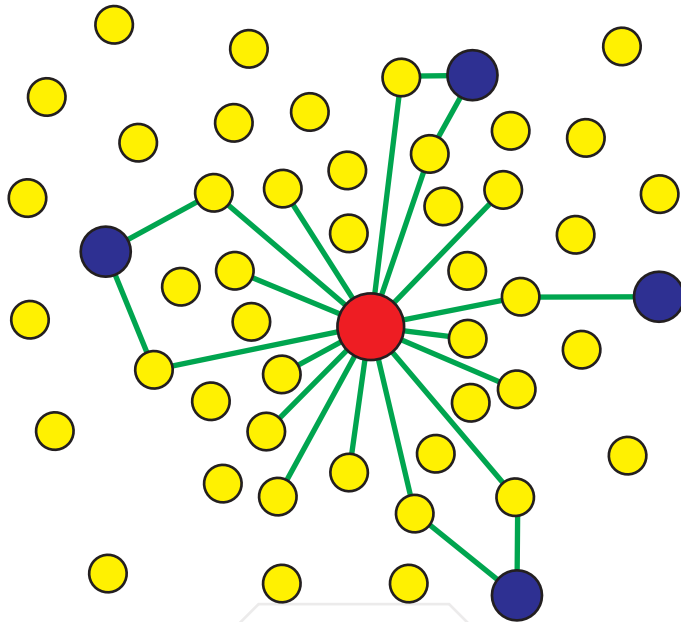
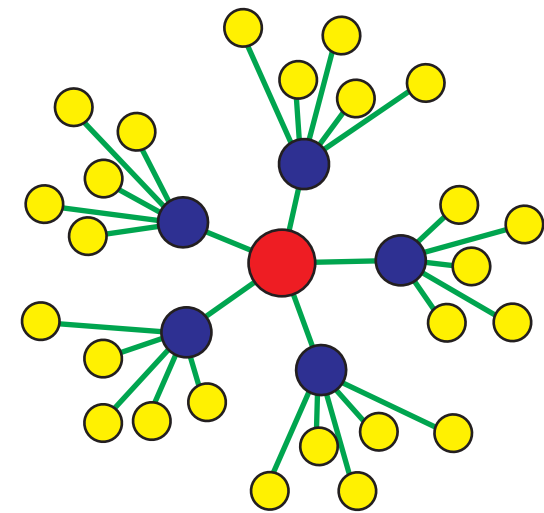


Old System

Pro's of the old system

- Every campus can have its own Crime Stoppers program, independent of all other campuses and separate from Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc. program.

Con's of the old system

- Each and every campus has to have its' own campus program which essentially eliminates almost 80% of the schools in El Paso.
- Each school is required to maintain all records, funds, payments, cases, etc. and guarantee the anonymity of the student/caller.
- If there is a issue at a particular campus, essentially the school district could be held accountable and possibly involved in a law suit.
- Each campus is responsible for raising and managing their own individual reward funds.
- 1-2 coordinators can not connect and oversee all 30+ campuses.
- Each individual school is responsible for taking the appropriate action(s) when a crime has been committed.
- Each campus required a minimum of \$500 start up costs.

Pro's of the new system

- All schools are "covered" regardless if they have a club or not
- One phone number is marketed
- All tips will be handled through law enforcement
- Only the Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc. office and the Law Enforcement agency for that school district will deal with tips
- All rewards will be paid from the Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc. program
- Campus Crime Stopper Clubs become optional, and if created, would comply with individual school district policies
- All fund-raising for "campus" rewards will be the responsibility of Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc.
- 1-2 coordinators only need to contact 5-6 individuals who in turn contact all the schools in their district
- Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc. will assist any campus wishing to create a club
- No start up costs

Con's of the new system

- There are none. This will allow all students to use the system, ensure anonymity, place all the burden on Crime Stoppers of El Paso, Inc.
